Greenbrier Community College Foundation Scholarships are awarded to residents of Greenbrier, Monroe, or Pocahontas counties who are attending the Greenbrier Valley campus of New River Community and Technical College in Lewisburg or other locations in the three counties served by the Greenbrier Valley campus.

Applications and additional information about the scholarship requirements are available in the Student Services Office of New River Community and Technical College located in Greenbrier Hall Room 235, 101 Church Street, Lewisburg, West Virginia 24901. Additional information is also available in the following locations: Pocahontas County High School, James Monroe High School, Greenbrier West High School, Greenbrier East High School, and New River Community and Technical College Library (all campuses) and our website, www.newriver.edu.

Veronica Blanton Nursing Scholarship

The Veronica Blanton Nursing Scholarship is endowed by the Alicia McCormick Memorial fund as a perpetual memorial to Veronica Blanton. The total award is up to \$1,250 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in an accredited course of study, preferably a nursing student who is a single parent with financial need.
- The student must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 credit hours per semester and maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be renewed automatically if the recipient continues to meet the award criteria.

Hollowell Scholarships

The Hollowell Scholarships were established by the Board of Directors of the Hollowell Foundation to promote and enhance the quality of life for citizens of the Greenbrier Valley. Two scholarships are offered each semester with a total award of \$1,500 each and may be used for tuition, laboratory fees, and books.

Criteria for Selection

- Hollowell Scholars can be high school seniors or adult students.
- Applicants must demonstrate moral character, personal integrity, scholastic success, leadership, and community activities.
- Recipients must be enrolled as full-time students taking a minimum of 12 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants should refer to the Hollowell Scholarship Mission Statement and submit a Hollowell Scholarship Application. The application must include a one-page, typed letter describing a past accomplishment that makes you proud and an explanation of your future goals.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be renewed. Refer to the Hollowell Scholarship Mission Statement for renewal procedures.

Babe and Sidney Louis Hyatt Scholarships

The Babe and Sidney Louis Hyatt Scholarships were established for students who share the Hyatt brothers' interests, which included agriculture, business, religious fidelity, reading, respect for family and community traditions, and self improvement. Two scholarships are awarded each year with a total award up to \$1,000 each.

Criteria for Selection

- High school seniors, adult students, and GED holders are invited to apply.
- Recipients must be enrolled as full-time students taking at least 12 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Honoring the Jewish faith was important to the Hyatt brothers and the notions of righteousness they valued; therefore, applicants must read about the Jewish folklore of the "Thirty-Six Hidden Saints" and submit an original 500-word, typed essay describing someone they have know whose life reminds them of these saints. Reference materials are available in the GVC campus library.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be awarded to the same individual a second year, but the student must reapply and compete with other applicants.

McElhenny-Fry-Kirven Scholarship

The McElhenny-Fry-Kirven Scholarship was given to the Greenbrier Community College Foundation, Inc. by the Elizabeth Fry and Dupont Kirven Foundation to honor the Reverend John and Mrs. Rebecca Walkup McElhenney, organizers of the Lewisburg Academy in 1812, which is now the Greenbrier Valley Campus of New River Community and Technical College. This scholarship is awarded on the basis of student achievements and aspirations in academics, leadership, and citizenship, and is not awarded on the basis of financial need. The total award is up to \$2,500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be enrolled as full-time students taking at least 15 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.2 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a typewritten essay (limit of 1,000 words) reflecting on the particular values shown in the life of Reverend John and Mrs. Rebecca Walkup McElhenney and how one or more of those values are reflected in the applicant's academic, leadership, and citizenship achievements and aspirations.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be automatically renewed for a second year upon submission of evidence that the student meets renewal criteria.

George and Helen Aide Scholarship

The George and Helen Aide Scholarship was established to assist students attending New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be renewed a second year, but students must reapply and compete with other applicants.

John Bowling, Jr. Scholarship

The John Bowling, Jr. Scholarship was established by Bruce, Connie, Jay, and Martha Bowling in memory of their father to assist students attending New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Gail C. Collins Memorial Scholarship

The Gail C. Collins Memorial Scholarship was established by Catherine and Victor Jost and friends of Gail C. Collins. The total award is up to \$650 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

The first preference of the award is to a resident of White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia. The second preference is to a student who is currently employed, associated with, or pursuing a career in the hospitality industry. The scholarship may be awarded a second year, but the student must reapply and compete with other applicants.

Madlyn E. Fort Health Sciences Scholarship

The Madlyn E. Fort Health Sciences Scholarships were established by Dr. and Mrs. Kyle F. Fort as perpetual memorials to his mother, Madlyn E. Fort. This scholarship is awarded to recent high school graduates or adult students admitted to an accredited course of study in health sciences. One full-time scholarship and two part-time scholarships are awarded each year. The total amounts are: 1) full-time student - total award up to \$2,500 per year; 2) part-time students - total awards up to \$1,250 per year each.

Criteria for Selection

- Full-time scholarship recipient must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours.
- Part-time scholarship recipients must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- Students must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application. Applicants must submit high school or college reports showing achievement in health sciences courses or employment or other volunteer work in health sciences along with three written references verifying the applicant's interest in health sciences from persons engaged in sciences careers.

Scholarship Awards

These scholarship may be automatically renewed a second year if the students meet renewal criteria.

Jeanne and Lawson Hamilton Scholarship

The Jeanne and Lawson Hamilton Scholarship was established to assist students attending New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$600 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be enrolled in at minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be renewed a second year, but students must reapply and compete with other applicants.

Helen Virginia Chadwick Irons Scholarship

The Helen Virginia Chadwick Irons Scholarship was endowed by Kate Fife, Thomas Greenstreet, and Virginia Wilson in honor of their grandmother to assist a female student attending New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$550 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a female student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Ann and Richard Kline Scholarship

The Ann and Richard Kline scholarship was established by Dr. and Mrs. Kline to assist a student attending New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Edward D. Knight, Jr. Scholarship

The Edward D. Knight, Jr. Scholarship was established by Mrs. E.D. Knight, Jr. and Mr. and Mrs. E.D. Knight, III to assist a student attending New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$2,000 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a full-time student enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be renewed a second year, but students must reapply and compete with other applicants.

Joan C. Browning Community Service Scholarship

The Joan C. Browning Community Service Scholarship was established to award students who have engaged in volunteer service to their community in the Greenbrier Valley. The total award is up to \$550 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Mary Louise & Jim Kilcollin Scholarship

The Mary Louise & Jim Kilcollin Scholarship is endowed by Dr. and Mrs. Mark C. Kilcollin in memory of Dr. Kilcollin's parents. The total award is up to \$550 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Horace McGraw Scholarship

The Horace McGraw Scholarship is endowed by Mr. Joe McGraw in memory of his father. The total award is up to \$650 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Old Stone Presbyterian Women Scholarship

The Old Stone Presbyterian Women Scholarship was established to assist a student attending classes in the Greenbrier Hall on the campus of New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$2,000 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a full-time student enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

This scholarship may be renewed an additional year.

Elizabeth W. Runyon Scholarship

The Elizabeth W. Runyon Scholarship is endowed by Donald R. and Shirley F. Runyon in memory of Donald L. Runyon's mother to encourage and enable students to pursue careers in health sciences. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student admitted to an accredited course of study in health sciences.
- Recipient must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

John L. Stewart, Jr. Memorial Scholarship

The John L. Stewart, Jr. Memorial Scholarship is endowed by Rosalie Stewart Detch in memory of her brother John L. Stewart to assist a student attending New River Community and Technical College. The total award is up to \$2,000 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Student Teaching Scholarship

The Student Teaching Scholarship was established by an anonymous donor to assist students during the student teaching semester. The total award is up to \$600.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a full-time student enrolled in the student teaching semester.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Benjamin Fort Teacher Scholarship

The Benjamin Fort Teacher Scholarship is endowed by Dr. and Mrs. Kyle F. Fort in honor of Dr. Fort's father in an effort to encourage and enable students who aspire to teaching careers. Two scholarships are offered each year with a total award up to \$800 each.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

Preference is given to students aspiring to teaching careers.

Herkness Mathematics Scholarship

The Herkness Mathematics Scholarship was endowed by Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Herkness to assist students studying mathematics curriculum. The total award is up to \$550 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

David B. McClung Memorial Scholarship

The David B. McClung Memorial Scholarship is offered by the Greenbrier Valley Dental Society to promote and enable students pursuing careers in the healthcare industry. The total award is up to \$1,000 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Donald R. Runyon Scholarship

The Donald R. Runyon Scholarship is endowed by Mrs. Shirley F. Runyon in memory of Donald R. Runyon. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in a minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

Preference is given to students aspiring to a career in business.

Judy D. Campbell Scholarship

The Judy D. Campbell Scholarship is endowed by Michael G. Campbell and was established to assist students who are residents of Greenbrier, Monroe, or Pocahontas counties. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a resident of Greenbrier, Monroe, or Pocahontas counties in West Virginia.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

David and Bertha Moshy Scholarship

The David and Bertha Moshy Scholarship is endowed by Dr. Joseph Moshy in honor of his parents. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a resident of Greenbrier, Monroe, or Pocahontas County in West Virginia.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Greg Carter Greenbrier Hometown Hero Scholarship

The Greg Carter Greenbrier Hometown Hero Scholarship is endowed by Roger and Phyllis Boone as a permanent memorial to Fairlea Volunteer Fireman, Greg Scott Carter. The total award is up to \$750 per year.

Criteria for Selection

Recipient must fit within one of the following categories:

- Volunteer firefighter, spouse, or dependent of a volunteer firefighter
- Law enforcement officer or employee, or spouse or dependent of a law enforcement officer or employee
- Student who either volunteers in or is employed in another Hometown Heroes organization, or the spouse or dependent of another Hometown Hero.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

Preference is given to a student who struggles with academic work but who remains a student in good standing taking one or more courses at New River Community and Technical College.

D. Reginald and Nelle C. Dixon Scholarship

The D. Reginald and Nelle C. Dixon Scholarship was endowed to support and aid students pursuing a career in the hospitality industry.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipient must be a student enrolled in at minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

Students must apply and compete with other applicants.

Educator's Scholarship

The Educator's Scholarship is endowed by an anonymous donor. The total award is up to \$500 per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipients must be a student enrolled in at minimum of 6 semester hours.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.
- Recipient must be a resident of Greenbrier, Monroe, or Pocahontas County in West Virginia.

Application Process

Applicants must submit a New River Community and Technical College Foundation scholarship application.

Scholarship Award

Students must apply and compete with other applicants.

Marlinton Rotary Club Health Sciences Scholarship

The Marlinton Rotary Club Health Sciences Scholarships are established to provide assistance to graduating seniors from Pocahontas County High School pursuing careers in health care. The awards are up to \$1,000 each per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Recipients must be graduates of Pocahontas County High School.
- Recipients must be enrolled in an allied health program at New River Community and Technical College and maintain a minimum of 9 credit hours each semester.
- The student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average.

Application Process

Applications may be obtained from the Marlinton Rotary Club.

Ruritan National Foundation Scholarship

Ruritan National Foundation Scholarships are awarded by the Ruritan National Foundation in partnership with New River Community and Technical College to provide financial assistance to students to further their education past high school. The total award is up to \$1,200 per student per year.

Criteria for Selection

- Student must demonstrate financial need, good character, and academic promise.
- Applicants must have the endorsement of two Ruritan.

Student Government Association Scholarship – Beckley/Raleigh County Campus

Application Process

Byrd-Prillerman High School Memorial Scholarship

The Byrd Prillerman High School Memorial Scholarship is a needs based scholarship awarded by the Beckley Area Foundation. The total award is up to \$400 per year.

Criteria for Selection

Recipient must be residents from the "Main Gulf" area of Raleigh County, which includes the following: Fireco, Hot Coal, Helen, McAlpin, Stotesbury, Tams, Ury, Amigo, Rhodell, East Gulf, Besco, Mead, Killarney, Pickshin, Slab Fork, Whitby, Winding Gulf, Affinity, and Lillybrook.
